**Subject:** Agreement with El Centro de Libertad for Substance Use Disorder  
Outpatient Treatment Services and Seeking Safety Services

**RECOMMENDATION:**

Adopt a resolution authorizing an agreement with El Centro de Libertad for substance use disorder outpatient treatment and recovery services and Seeking Safety services, for the term July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017, in an amount not to exceed \$1,843,315.

**BACKGROUND:**

Behavioral Health and Recovery Services (BHRS) has contracted with El Centro de Libertad (El Centro) for over 20 years for substance use disorder outpatient treatment and recovery services to San Mateo County residents. These services are focused on an individualized outpatient treatment program that includes family group therapy, alcohol and drug testing, relapse prevention, adolescent treatment, and anger management.

In April 2015, El Centro responded to a Request for Proposals and was selected to provide Prevention and Early Intervention services for transition age youth that are delivered in a non-traditional behavioral health setting, using the "Seeking Safety" service model.

**DISCUSSION:**

El Centro shall continue to provide outpatient group and individual treatment to adolescent and adult residents of the County. Through the Seeking Safety service model, El Centro shall continue to provide a present-focused therapy, helping people attain safety from trauma/Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) and substance abuse. The Seeking Safety curriculum shall be used when appropriate for both substance

abuse and dependence, as well as with people who have a trauma history but do not meet the criteria for PTSD.

In April 2016, the California Department of Health Care Services and the federal government approved the Drug Medi-Cal Organized Delivery System waiver. The Drug Medi-Cal waiver will change the delivery of substance use disorder services, allowing providers such as El Centro to bill for many more services than they were previously able. Therefore, BHRS is requesting that the Board waive the Request for Proposals process for outpatient substance use disorder treatment services for one year, allowing time for BHRS to establish the quantity of provider services, as well as how services will be delivered due to implementation of the Drug Medi-Cal Organized Delivery System waiver.

The Resolution contains the County's standard provision allowing amendment of the County's fiscal obligations by a maximum of \$25,000 (in aggregate).

The agreement and Resolution have been reviewed and approved by County Counsel as to form.

Approval of this agreement contributes to the Shared Vision 2025 outcome of a Healthy Community by providing individuals and families with prevention and treatment services to support recovery, which in turn contributes to the health and safety of communities throughout the County. Successful treatment discharge occurs when a program participant completes his/her treatment/recovery plan or when a participant is transferred to the next appropriate level of care. It is anticipated that 77% of clients will achieve a successful treatment discharge.

**FISCAL IMPACT:**

The term of the agreement is July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017. The amount of the agreement is not to exceed \$1,843,315. Of this amount, the Mental Health Services Act will fund \$60,355, Federal Financial Participation for Drug Med-Cal \$37,500, Substance Abuse and Prevention Treatment Block Grant will fund \$67,735, CalWORKs will fund \$10,000, 2011 Realignment will fund \$342,168, and AB109 will fund \$278,877. The remaining \$1,046,680 is Net County Cost. Funds for these services are included in the BHRS FY 2016-17 Recommended Budget. The payment provisions and levels of service remain essentially the same as those of the prior agreement.
