- B) The Parks Director, or the Parks Director's designee, to execute further amendments to the agreement to modify the County's maximum fiscal obligation by no more than \$25,000 (in aggregate), and/or to modify the agreement's terms and/or services, so long as the modified term(s) and/or services is/are within the current or revise fiscal provisions.
