Facts

- National Survey on Drug Use and Health
- 2023: an estimated 17% of people aged 12 or older in the US had a substance use disorder in the last year—that is 48.5 million people
 - Almost 21 million considered themselves to be in recovery or have recovered from their drug or alcohol use problem
- BHRS provided substance use disorder and mental health treatment to 14,213 individuals last fiscal year

Language Services: Staff speak English, Spanish and Chinese. For other languages, they will assist you though a free telephone interpreter service.

How do I get help for my alcohol and drug use in San Mateo County?



Pick the language you speak and pick option 4 for "mental health and substance use". It is important that YOU call or give permission to allow family or friends to speak for you.

- Give your name, birthday and phone number or email address.
- If you have insurance give this information.
 You do not need to have insurance to get help.
- You will be connected to speak to a trained person who will ask you more questions to help you find the right type of care.

Anything you tell this person on the phone will not be shared unless you allow it.

Services are available if you have:

- Care Advantage/Cal Medi-Connect
- Healthy Kids
- Health Worx
- · Access and Care for Everyone (ACE)

If you have other or no insurance the ACCESS Call Center can still help you find care. The Call Center can also help you get insurance if you want it.
