The network is managed carefully to assure the right services are provided, the County is only billed for what was authorized, and monitors the quality of care, taking necessary action to assure high quality services.	Under the B-1 Administrative Memorandum selection of providers of mental health services for individual private psychiatrists, psychologists, therapists and group practices are exempt from the requirement for a Request for Proposals (RFP) process. BHRS will consider contracts with any and all qualified providers for inclusion in the SPPN Network. This waiver will enable BHRS to operate and provide services to individuals who are primarily receiving treatment for serious mental illness (SMI).
