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RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING "NO PARKING" ZONES ALONG EL CAMINO REAL (STATE HIGHWAY 82) AT VARIOUS LOCATIONS WITHIN THE UNINCORPORATED COLMA AREA AS DEPICTED ON EXHIBIT A

RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo, State of California, that

WHEREAS, California Vehicle Code Section 22507 et seq. and Section 7.30.010 et seq. of the San Mateo County Ordinance Code allow this Board of Supervisors to prohibit or restrict the stopping, parking or standing of vehicles by resolution or ordinance with associated signs and markings in their respective jurisdictions on a state highway if the resolution or ordinance establish said restrictions are first submitted and approved in writing by the Department of Transportation; and

WHEREAS, the Director of Public Works has recommended that "No Parking" zones be established as noted herein and as depicted on Exhibit A attached hereto; and

WHEREAS, parking restrictions may apply to state highways provided the resolution or ordinance establishing said restrictions are submitted and approved in writing by the California Department of Transportation; and

WHEREAS, this Board has reviewed and concurs with the recommendation of the Director of Public Works.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY DETERMINED AND ORDERED that:

- 1) "No Parking" zones are declared to exist at the following locations:
 - A.) On the westerly side of El Camino Real commencing 18 feet south of the center line of A Street, extending southerly a distance of 13 feet, more or less.
 - B.) On the westerly side of El Camino Real commencing 46 feet north of the center line of Albert M Teglia Boulevard, extending northerly a distance of 38 feet, more or less.
 - C.) On the easterly side of El Camino Real commencing 36 feet north of the center line of A Street, extending northerly a distance of 16 feet, more or less.
 - D.) On the easterly side of El Camino Real commencing 31 feet south of the center line of C Street, extending southerly a distance of 62 feet, more or less.
- 2) The Director of Public Works is authorized to send a copy of this Resolution to the California Department of Transportation to review and approve in writing such changes.

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
