- A) ADOPTING PLANS AND SPECIFICATIONS, INCLUDING CONFORMANCE WITH PREVAILING WAGE SCALE REQUIREMENTS, FOR THE COUNTY SERVICE AREA (CSA) NO. 7 WATER SYSTEM DISTRIBUTION PIPELINE IMPROVEMENT PROJECT; AND**
- B) AUTHORIZING THE DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC WORKS TO CALL FOR SEALED PROPOSALS TO BE RECEIVED BY WEDNESDAY, MARCH 25, 2026 AT 2:00 P.M., IN THE OFFICE OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE OFFICER/CLERK OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS; AND**
- C) AUTHORIZING THE DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC WORKS TO EXTEND THE CALL FOR BIDS AND BID OPENING UP TO SIXTY (60) CALENDAR DAYS BEYOND THE TIME AND DATE ORIGINALLY SET FORTH BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS**

RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo, State of California, acting as the Governing Board of the County Service Area No. 7 (CSA 7), that

WHEREAS, on December 28, 1965, this Board adopted Resolution No. 22014 establishing CSA 7 for the purpose of furnishing the extended county service of water facilities and services, and for the acquiring, construction, repair and management of a water system and facilities for supplying water as may be required within the service area; and

WHEREAS, in 2015, the Department of Public Works (Department) finalized the Water System Feasibility Study and Seismic Retrofit Report, which recommended replacement of the existing treated water infrastructure serving the Northern Distribution

System supplying Memory Lane, the La Honda Trailer Park and Pope Rd due to identified conditions, operational issues, and necessary repairs; and

WHEREAS, the Department retained Water Works Engineers to develop plans and specifications to replace the above-mentioned portions supplying the treated water system identified in the CSA 7 Water System Distribution Pipeline Improvement Project (Project); and

WHEREAS, plans and specifications dated February 20, 2026 have been prepared and approved by the Director of Public Works for the Project and said plans and specifications have been filed in the office of the Director of Public Works (the “plans and specifications”); and

WHEREAS, the plans and specifications require that the contractors performing the work pay not less than the general prevailing wages, as established by the Department of Industrial Relations, in the locality in which said work is to be performed for each type of worker needed to execute the contract.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY DETERMINED AND ORDERED as follows:

1. The plans and specifications dated February 20, 2026 for the aforesaid Project, which are on file in the office of the Director of Public Works, and to which reference is hereby made for further particulars, are hereby approved and adopted as the plans and specifications to be adhered to in letting and performing the work under a contract for the improvements described therein.

2. Said specifications require that the contractors performing the work pay not less than the general prevailing wages, as established by the Department of Industrial Relations, in the locality in which said work is to be performed for each type of worker needed to execute the contract.
3. The Department of Public Works is authorized and directed to issue a call for sealed bids and to set the bid opening date and time on Wednesday, March 25, 2026 at 2:00 p.m. in the office of the County Executive Officer/Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in County Office Building 3, 500 County Center, Redwood City, California. Said bids will be received by the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors and then transmitted to the County Executive's Office in said County Office Building 3 and be publicly opened and declared.
4. The Director of Public Works is authorized to extend the call for bids and bid opening up to sixty (60) calendar days beyond the time and date originally set forth by the Board of Supervisors.
5. The Department of Public Works is further directed to cause the Notice inviting sealed bids to be published for two (2) times in a weekly local newspaper of general circulation, published in the County, and obtain an affidavit of said publication, a copy of which shall be placed on file with the Department of Public Works.

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
