Dear President Horsley and Supervisors,

The Sierra Club Loma Prieta Chapter has consistently presented our opposition to permitting off-leash dogs at Pillar Point, both in written form (letter of 11/01/21 attached) and by oral comment from Chapter leadership during San Mateo County's public process at the Parks Commission, Planning Commission and Board of Supervisors meetings on this topic.

We particularly support the February 9, 2022, decision of your Planning Commission to deny a coastal development permit, as presented, that would have allowed off-leash dogs at both Pillar Point Bluff and Quarry Park.

The appeal of that decision now before you would modify the Planning Commission's denial as applying only to Pillar Point Bluff and not to Quarry Park. This concept had support from the Planning Commissioners during their deliberations but the Commission was constrained to address only the permit as presented.

The Sierra Club Loma Prieta Chapter supports the compromise now before you.

Additionally, we are hopeful that your Board will also take it into consideration that there currently exists a high level of non-compliance - 48% - at Pillar Point Bluff as shown in your certified environmental document. We believe that this functions as a coastal access discouragement not only to pedestrians and equestrians but also to those people who follow the County's leash law.

We thank the Parks Director and Planning Staff for bringing this compromise forward for your consideration and we are hopeful for your support.

In walking the beach this morning, I came across TWO dead harbor seal pups, barely weeks old. Please give the Fitzgerald Marine Reserve all the help it can get, in order to protect this sensitive habitat from the off-leash dogs that will only increase if they are allowed on the bluffs above.

As someone who has been walking her dogs on the Pillar Point Trails for years (even before the bulldozers arrived to make the current well-groomed trails), I object strenuously to the current dog culture of off-leash dog walking. The dog owners do not respect the leash. They assume that every person with a dog is there to allow their dog to meet and greet other dogs, in fact, they insist on it. The owner and dog that are there to enjoy a walk together are not allowed to pass without a confrontation, even when the owner makes it clear that other dogs should not be allowed to approach.

Even those dog owners that are following the current off-leash rules share this attitude. They suggest that those people walking on the bluff trails that don't like it should go elsewhere. Well, I have, but I don't think it's fair to all of the other users of the Pillar Point Bluff trails, especially those without dogs.

Before the arrival of the GGNRA, off-leash dog walking (along with a multitude of other uses), worked well on the Montara mountain meadows. There is room there for half-acre impromptu dog parks, for trails that bypass those fields, and a fairly degraded botanical environment (though still rich in wildlife) compared to the pristine coastal chaparral of the Pillar Point Bluff. There was also a dog culture which communicated well, shared information about dogs, and took responsibility for their own and their dogs' behavior. It would be wonderful if we could return to that dog culture, but the Pillar Point Bluff is not the place—just not enough room.

On 3-28-22, myself and another volunteer were doing a seal survey at Fitzgerald Marine Reserve. Our survey takes us through the entire Reserve and up onto the entire Bluff. The Bluffs, while considered separate park, are a part of the Reserve. At the beginning of the survey, Rangers were escorting a couple with an off leash dog from a restricted area at FMR. The couple violently attacked us with their dog charging at us. One volunteer was brutally beaten unconscious and her camera was stolen. She suffered terrible injuries. My injuries are less severe and the toll it has taken on me is big.

Off leash dogs on the Bluffs are rampant. County Parks is not present to monitor the area nor do they say they plan too. I have seen many people approached by off leash dogs that do not desire the interaction, myself included. I have seen people with dogs on leash approached by off leash dogs that do not desire the interaction. I know people that won't even go to the Bluffs because of all the off leash dogs. I, literally, can not even assign a number to the times I see dogs defecating in the bushes while the owner walks ahead and does not pick up the waste up.

A very important note is that the Bluffs have many narrow trails some of which are close to the edge of the Bluff. The off leash dogs are on every trail; not just the trail originally proposed in the pilot program. While a person may be able to navigate these trails by communicating with another person approaching, there is no way to communicate to an off leash dog how to cross the section of trail and that makes this very dangerous.

Lastly, the Bluffs are full of wildlife and important habitat. The off leash dogs keep the wildlife hiding for safety. Birds are kept from perching and the habitat is affected by the dogs going off trail and into the vegetation and bushes. Please protect the bluffs and end the off leash dogs in that area so that all people, leashed pets, the wildlife and habitat can be protected.
