- Our research indicates that the **strategies employed to foster resistance, resilience, and promote recovery** from substance use are **equally effective in preventing substance use** amongst Black youth and the community.
- Black Youth and community have expressed a desire for stronger connections within the Black Community. They seek support, resources, and opportunities to experience Black Joy, have a deeper cultural learning to combat loneliness, address grief/depression, and build resilience against the effects of racism.
- 7 **RECOMMENDATIONS** were created based on the findings for the County of San Mateo, community, and beyond
- beyond. As one of the recommendations, a county-wide Black Youth Advisory Board (BlackYAB) was created in 2024 to design programs with youth to meet their needs and interest. BACHAC has hosted 2 cohorts that have led youth activities, shared feedback on youth programming, and participated in your Leadership Challenge.
