WHEREAS, *OLA MAE AUGMON* moved to East Palo Alto in 1960 with her late husband, George Augmon, and together they raised a family and became deeply rooted in the community; and

WHEREAS, *OLA MAE AUGMON* has served with distinction on the City of East Palo Alto's Senior Advisory Committee since her appointment in September 2006, bringing 19 years of unwavering commitment to ensuring that the city's senior population is heard, respected, and uplifted; and

WHEREAS, during her tenure, *OLA MAE AUGMON* held leadership roles including Chairwoman and Parliamentarian, championing the rights and dignity of seniors and promoting open communication between the Committee and the East Palo Alto City Council; and

WHEREAS, *OLA MAE AUGMON* was a committed advocate for programs that supported the social, educational, and recreational enrichment of seniors, and helped to bridge the generational divide through intergenerational collaborations with groups such as Youth United for Community Action (YUCA); and

WHEREAS, *OLA MAE AUGMON* also contributed to the cultural and artistic life of East Palo Alto, hand-quilting each Friday alongside fellow community members including Dorothy Lewis, and celebrating this work at the Cooley Landing Education Center Grand Opening, an event that symbolizes the legacy of community, creativity, and continuity; and
