RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A ONE-TIME GRANT OF DISTRICT-DISCRETIONARY MEASURE K FUNDS, NOT TO EXCEED \$164,000, TO UNITED THROUGH EDUCATION/FAMILIAS UNIDAS TO PROVIDE PARENTING CLASSES TAUGHT IN SPANISH IN NORTH FAIR OAKS, BELLE HAVEN AND EAST PALO ALTO FOR THE 2023-2024 SCHOOL YEAR, PROVIDING AN EXCEPTION TO THE CRITERIA FOR DISTRICT-DISCRETIONARY MEASURE K FUNDS TO ALLOW REPEAT FUNDING WITHIN THE CURRENT BUDGET CYCLE, AND AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE, OR DESIGNEE, TO EXECUTE THE GRANT AGREEMENT

RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo, State of California, that

WHEREAS, Measure K is the half-cent general sales tax initially approved by San Mateo County voters in November 2012, and extended in November 2016 for a total of thirty years; and

WHEREAS, the Board and County staff have conducted study sessions and community outreach efforts to inform priorities for **Measure K** spending; and

WHEREAS, on March 9, 2021, and March 23, 2021, the Board held study sessions on **Measure K** expenditures and anticipated revenue for fiscal years (FY) 2021-23, and approved the allocation of \$5 million in one-time loans or grants for the FY 2021-23 budget cycle, divided equally among the supervisorial districts, for district-discretionary needs and projects; and

WHEREAS, Supervisorial District 4 has requested a one-time \$164,000 grant to United through Education/Familias Unidas to provide parenting classes, taught in

Spanish, in North Fair Oaks, Belle Haven and East Palo Alto for the 2023-2024 school year; and

WHEREAS, this item is consistent with the criteria for district-discretionary **Measure K** funds approved by the Board in December 2018, with the following exception: the grant would be the second grant of district-discretionary funding to the same organization within the current FY 2021-23 budget cycle; and

WHEREAS, the Board finds that the exception is warranted in this instance because of the need for parenting education classes taught in Spanish has grown, in part due to the COVID-19 pandemic, and the organization is expanding into vulnerable communities including East Palo Alto and Belle Haven; and

WHEREAS, there are sufficient **Measure K** funds in the Non-Departmental Services FY 2022-23 Adopted Budget for this purpose; and

WHEREAS, it is the Board's intent for the County Executive, or designee, to execute an agreement in the amount of \$164,000 to United through Education/Familias Unidas, and setting forth the terms of the grant in furtherance of the objectives set forth in the Project Summary section in the Board transmittal accompanying this resolution; and

WHEREAS, this Board has been presented with a form of the grant agreement and has examined it and approved it as to both form and content and desires to enter into the agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY DETERMINED AND ORDERED that the Board of Supervisors approves of said grant, and authorizes the County Executive, or designee, to execute said grant agreement.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Executive or designee is authorized to execute amendments to the grant agreement which modify the County's maximum fiscal obligation by no more than ten percent (10%) or \$25,000 (in aggregate), whichever is less, and/or modify the contract term and/or services so long as the modified term or services is/are within the current or revised fiscal provisions.
