BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, COUNTY OF SAN MATEO, STATE OF CALIFORNIA

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RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING A “NO PARKING” ZONE ON THE SOUTHERLY SIDE OF FIFTH AVENUE COMMENCING AT A POINT 42 FEET SOUTHWESTERLY OF THE INTERSECTION OF MIDDLEFIELD ROAD AND EXTENDING SOUTHWESTERLY A DISTANCE OF 89 FEET, MORE OR LESS

RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo, State of California, that

WHEREAS, California Vehicle Code Section 22507, et seq., and Section 7.30.010 of the San Mateo County Ordinance Code allow this Board of Supervisors to prohibit or restrict the stopping, parking or standing of vehicles by resolution or ordinance with associated signs and markings; and

WHEREAS, Middlefield Road is generally oriented in a north-south direction; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Public Works seeks to improve the usability and efficiency of the right-turn only lane for the eastbound traffic on Fifth Avenue at and approaching Middlefield Road; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Public Works has evaluated the area and determined that there is inadequate space for vehicles to enter the right-turn only lane when parked vehicles are present; and

WHEREAS, the Director of Public Works has recommended that a “No Parking” zone be established as noted herein and on Exhibit “A” attached hereto; and

WHEREAS, this Board has reviewed and concurs with the recommendation of the Director of Public Works.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY DETERMINED AND ORDERED as follows:

1. A "No Parking" zone is declared to exist on the southerly side of Fifth Avenue (County Road R-23) commencing at a point 42 feet southwesterly of the centerline of Middlefield Road and extending southwesterly on Fifth Avenue a distance of 89 feet, more or less.
2. The Department of Public Works is authorized and directed to post any necessary signs and pavement markings.

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
