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RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A GRANT AGREEMENT WITH JEFFERSON UNION HIGH SCHOOL DISTRICT TO SUPPORT THE PROVISION OF BEHAVIORAL HEALTH AND YOUTH LEADERSHIP PROGRAMS TO IMPROVE LOCAL HEALTH OUTCOMES AND ADVANCE HEALTH EQUITY FOR THE TERM OF SEPTEMBER 1, 2024, THROUGH JUNE 30, 2027, IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$742,712.84

RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo, State of California, that

WHEREAS, **Measure K** is the half-cent general sales tax initially approved by the San Mateo County voters in November 2012 and extended through November 2016 for a total of thirty years; and

WHEREAS, this Board desired to reexamine **Measure K** funding priorities and processes for allocation funds; and

WHEREAS, in response to this Board’s direction, County staff gathered community input regarding priorities for the allocation of **Measure K** funds; and

WHEREAS, this Board finalized and approved three priority areas for FY 2024-25 **Measure K** funding, including Children, Families and Seniors; Housing and Homelessness; and Emergency Preparedness; and

WHEREAS, through a Notice of Funding Opportunity process, Jefferson Union High School District was selected to enhance the provision of behavioral health services and support youth leadership programs to improve local health outcomes and advance health equity; and

WHEREAS, the term of the grant agreement is September 1, 2024, through June 30, 2027, for an amount not to exceed \$742,712.84; and

WHEREAS, this Board has been presented with the agreement and has approved it as to both form and content and desires to enter into the agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY DETERMINED AND ORDERED that the President of this Board of Supervisors be and is hereby authorized and directed to execute said agreement for and on behalf of the County of San Mateo, and the Clerk of this Board shall attest the President's signature thereto.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chief of San Mateo County Health or designee is authorized to execute contract amendments which modify the County's maximum fiscal obligation by no more than \$25,000 (in aggregate), and/or modify the contract term and/or services so long as the modified term or services is/are within the current or revised fiscal provisions.

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
