PROCLAMATION DESIGNATING OCTOBER 2018 AS

DIVERSITY WORKFORCE MONTH

CELEBRATING THE EXPERIENCED WORKER

PROCLAIMED, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo, State of California, that

WHEREAS, since 2010, Phase2Careers has been serving the “Over 40” professionals and the employers that serve them in the San Francisco Bay Area by assisting with new job searches, career exploration, and career advancement; and

WHEREAS, the mission of Phase2Careers is to prepare and empower the “Over 40” worker for career opportunities in the new economy by providing employment roundtables, job search review panels, employer forums and career industry panels, career fairs and mixers, and career assessment; and
