Dispatch 1653-Grass Fire



Key Incident Details:

- The 2nd Alarm was called (1700): upon arrival Sent to Canada Collage corp. yard for structure protection Div. D
- Upon arrival, NB 280 at the Farm Hill on-ramp, $\frac{3}{4}$ of an acre, moderate rate of spread, a slope driven fire
- The 3rd alarm was called (1713): The fire crested the top of the hill, and a strong gust of wind pushed it to the center divide
- The 3rd alarm was assigned Div N: Farm Hill under 280 and the on-ramp to 280 SB
- The 4th Alarm was called (1719) and sent directly to Mission Trail and Canada Rd. (Div X) for structure protection and intel on the fire spread



Temperature: 89°F
Relative Humidity: 22%
Wind: 2-3 mph

Dispatch 1653-Grass Fire



Key Incident Details:

- Upon the arrival of BC11, a Unified Command was established
- The Incident Commander contacted CHP and the Sheriff's Deputies to close the on and off ramps as well as North and South bound 280
- At approximately 1800 forward progress of the fire had been stopped
- No structures were damaged and minimal property loss, fence posts and cut fencing
- There was no need for evacuation of the surrounding neighborhood
- Fire Watch was established and remained through the night and the next day

CAL FIRE's Response and Coordination

- A Mutual Threat Zone (MTZ) is a geographical area between two or more jurisdictions into which those agencies would respond, providing automatic aid during initial attack.
- The Edgewood Fire was located within a Mutual Threat Zone (MTZ) within the Woodside Fire Protection District's Local Response Area (LRA)
- Due to the threat to the State Response Area (SRA), a full CAL FIRE Wildland Response was initiated
- CAL FIRE entered into Unified Command with Woodside Fire Protection District

CAL FIRE Resources Deployed to the Edgewood Fire

- 2 – Chief Officers (San Mateo County)
- 1 – Air Attack (OV-10 Air Tactical Aircraft)
- 2 – Air Tankers (S-2T Airtanker, 1200 Gallons of Retardant)
- 2 – Helicopters (s70i Fire Hawk, 1,000 Gallons of water and a FF Crew)
- 9 – Type 3 Wildland Fire Engines (San Mateo, Santa Cruz and Santa Clara Counties)
- 2 – Hand Crews (Glenwood Fire Center)
- 1 – Bull Dozer (Santa Clara County)
