MEASURE K: RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE USE OF DISTRICT-DISCRETIONARY MEASURE K FUNDS, NOT TO EXCEED \$50,000, TO ALLOW THE HUMAN RESOURCES DEPARTMENT TO LAUNCH AN EMPLOYEE SUGGESTION PROGRAM FOCUSED ON GENERATING AND IMPLEMENTING IDEAS RELATING TO COST SAVING MEASURES, AND OPERATIONAL EFFICIENCIES AND IMPROVEMENTS THAT BENEFIT THE ORGANIZATION AND RESIDENTS OF SAN MATEO COUNTY

**RESOLVED,** by the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo, State of California, that

WHEREAS, Measure K is the half-cent general sales tax initially approved by San Mateo County voters in November 2012, and extended in November 2016 for a total of thirty years; and

WHEREAS, the Board and County staff have conducted study sessions and community outreach efforts to inform priorities for Measure K spending; and

WHEREAS, the Board has held study sessions on Measure K expenditures and anticipated revenue for fiscal years (FY) 2024-25, and has approved funds, divided equally among the supervisorial districts, for one-time district-discretionary needs and projects; and

WHEREAS, Supervisorial District 1 has requested a one-time \$50,000 allocation of district-discretionary Measure K funds for an Employee Suggestion Program focused on generating and implementing ideas relating to cost saving measures, and operational efficiencies and improvements that benefit the organization

and residents of San Mateo County, to be managed by the San Mateo County Human Resources Department; and

WHEREAS, this item is consistent with the criteria for district-discretionary

Measure K funds approved by the Board in December 2018; and

WHEREAS, there are sufficient Measure K funds in the Non-Departmental Services FY 2024-25 Adopted Budget, and such funds will be rolled forward and transferred to the Human Resources Department during the September Revisions process and included in the FY 2025-26 Adopted Budget.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY DETERMINED AND ORDERED that the Board of Supervisors approves of said program and use of district-discretionary

Measure K funds.
