

**AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT  
BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF SAN MATEO AND  
SAN MATEO RESOURCE CONSERVATION DISTRICT**

THIS AMENDMENT TO THE AGREEMENT, entered into this 12<sup>th</sup> day of August, 2025, by and between the COUNTY OF SAN MATEO, hereinafter called "County," and SAN MATEO RESOURCE CONSERVATION DISTRICT, hereinafter called "Contractor";

**W I T N E S S E T H:**

WHEREAS, pursuant to Government Code, Section 31000, County may contract with independent contractors for the furnishing of such services to or for County or any Department thereof;

WHEREAS, the parties entered into an Agreement for Forest Health and Fire Resilience on 08/01/2023; and

WHEREAS, the parties wish to amend the Agreement to extend the term to June 30, 2026, increase the not to exceed amount to \$600,000, replace Exhibit A with Revised Exhibit A, and replace Exhibit B with Revised Exhibit B.

**NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY AGREED BY THE PARTIES HERETO AS FOLLOWS:**

- 1.**                               Section 3 Payments of the agreement is amended to read as follows:

In consideration of the services provided by Contractor in accordance with all terms, conditions, and specifications set forth in this Agreement and in Exhibit A, County shall make payment to Contractor based on the rates and in the manner specified in Exhibit B. County reserves the right to withhold payment if County determines that the quantity or quality of the work performed is unacceptable. In no event shall County's total fiscal obligation under this Agreement exceed SIX HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$600,000.00). In the event that the County makes any advance payments, Contractor agrees to refund any amounts in excess of the amount owed by the County at the time of contract termination or expiration. Contractor is not entitled to payment for work not performed as required by this agreement.

- 2.**                               Section 4 Term of the agreement is amended to read as follows:

Subject to compliance with all terms and conditions, the term of this Agreement shall be from August 1, 2023, through June 30, 2026

- 3.**                               Exhibit A is replaced with Revised Exhibit A (Rev. 06/24/2025)

- 4.**                               Exhibit B is replaced with Revised Exhibit B (Rev. 06/24/2025)

- 5.**                               **All other terms and conditions of the agreement dated 08/01/2023, between the County and Contractor shall remain in full force and effect.**

Revised Exhibit A (Rev. 08/12/2025)

In consideration of the payments set forth in Exhibit B, Contractor agrees that the funds received by Contractor ("Funds") in an amount not to exceed \$600,000 shall only be used for the purposes described in this exhibit.

**SCOPE OF SERVICES**

The contractor will provide the following services for forest health and fire resiliency that serve and directly benefit San Mateo County communities:

- a. Identify needed projects, implement, facilitate, and permit the following types of projects: Neighborhood Chipper program, Fire Adapted Communities, strategic fuel breaks, and landscape fuels treatment and vegetation management.
- b. Provide technical services to SMC landowners including, but not limited to, permitting, hazard tree removal, and fuel load reduction.
- c. Provide public engagement services including, but not limited to outreach, community events, print and website outreach materials.
- d. Provide coordination services including, but not limited to, connecting stakeholders for an integrated approach to forest health and fire resiliency.
- e. Provide program oversight and administration, including but not limited to, reporting, fire resiliency and forest health project management, grant application development and management, and vendor and partner coordination and management.
- f. Provide other forest health and fire & fuel mitigation projects or services to SMC communities with prior approval from the County.

**DELIVERABLES**

The Contractor will continue the work of providing the Neighborhood Chipper Program through June 30, 2026. This will result in approximately 15 communities (~275 to 550 homes/year) receiving chipping services one to two times per year. Additionally, the Contractor will work on developing plans and permits for a minimum of three forest health and fire resiliency projects that reduce wildfire risk along the San Mateo County coast. The Contractor will continue to advance permit streamlining tools to increase the pace and scale

of work in San Mateo County and the region. Additional services as outlined above, will be provided to benefit SMC communities.

All work performed will be completed by June 30, 2026. Contractor shall document the work performed and specific outcomes achieved under this contract and provide a status report upon invoicing the County. The status reports will include outcomes such as specific communities or individuals served, acres treated, or other appropriate metrics that show measurable outcomes.

The Contractor is a special district formed under California law to be locally governed with the independent board of directors that are accountable to our local communities, and all portions of the scope of the Project work that constitutes public works shall be competitively procured by the Contractor.

**Revised Exhibit B (Rev. 08/12/2025)**

In consideration of the services provided by Contractor described in Exhibit A and subject to the terms of the Agreement, County shall pay Contractor based on the following fee schedule and terms:

Pursuant to Section 3 of the Agreement, County's total payments for services shall not exceed \$600,000. Invoices shall be submitted by Contractor to the County on a quarterly basis using the County's Fiscal Year calendar. The final invoice should be submitted on or around June 30<sup>th</sup> 2026.

Copies of invoices or receipts for expenses

Contractor shall provide supporting documents concurrently upon invoice submittal, adequate to substantiate the charges. Adequate supporting documents include, but are not limited to: deliverable documents, payroll registers, timesheets, detailed invoices, inspection certificates, activity/participant logs, applicant forms, acceptance letters, survey forms, authorized travel/expense forms, service acknowledgment forms, etc. The types of supporting documents required to verify information on invoices depends on the specified contracted services and, if applicable, costs to be reimbursed. The County reserves the right to withhold payment on invoices until Contractor provides adequate

supporting documents. The adequacy of supporting documentation is in the sole discretion of the County.
