Significant budget changes

Revenues

- ✓ Diversifying fiscal revenue from sole reliance on Tobacco Tax Revenue through acquiring Other Grants from different funding sources.
- ✓ Increase Other Grant Revenue to 33% of fiscal revenue compared to 10% average of the last 10 years

Appropriations

- ✓ Implementation of the new Strategic Plan FY 2025-30
- ✓ Continue implementation the Baby Bonus Program



Priorities

- ✓ Implementation of the First 5 San Mateo County Strategic Plan FY 2025-30
- ✓ Continue efforts to acquire and execute new Other Grant awards from different funding sources for higher community investment.
- ✓ Continue implementation the Baby Bonus Program



Challenges

- Tobacco Tax Revenue continues to decline
 - √ decreased by 12% and 22% in FY 2022-23 and FY 2023-24 respectively, due to the negative impact of Prop 31- Flavor Ban
 - √ projected 5% average decline rate over period FY 2024-30.
- Continue to draw down from Fund Balances (Reserves*) to fund the strategic investment and operations
 - ✓ Continue commitment to invest at reasonable but reduced levels of services, as revenues continue to decline



State and Federal Changes:

- Uncertainty about Federal and State budgetary actions may:
 - ✓ Continue to watch State Budget for reductions that may affect children and families in San Mateo County and throughout the state







- c) Racial Equity, Human Centered Design (101) and Trauma & Resiliency Coaching




LOCAL INVESTMENTS (FY 23-24)

The San Mateo County Baby Bonus Program is an innovative, locally-focused demonstration project centered on understanding the value of cash aid and early childhood supports for new parents. The Program goes beyond existing baby bonus pilots by pairing unconditional cash gifts with coordinated care in the first three years of life.
