





NOTICE OF PROPOSED AWARDS Clean Transportation Program Grant Solicitation GFO-23-606 Charging Infrastructure for Government Fleets September 18, 2024

On December 21, 2023, the California Energy Commission (CEC) released a Grant Funding Opportunity entitled "Charging Infrastructure for Government Fleets" This competitive grant solicitation was an offer to fund projects that:

- Support electrification of light-duty government fleets in California by providing reliable and readily accessible electric vehicle charging infrastructure dedicated for these fleets.
- Support local government goals of sustainability and/or climate action plans.
- Reduce vehicle emissions in disadvantaged and/or low-income communities

The grant solicitation announced the availability of up to \$30 million to fund agreements resulting from this solicitation and that the CEC, at its sole discretion, reserves the right to increase or reduce the amount of funds available under this solicitation. The CEC is proposing to allocate approximately \$8 million in additional funding. A total of \$38,037,467 is now available under this solicitation.

The attached table, "Notice of Proposed Awards" identifies each applicant selected and recommended for funding by CEC staff and includes the amount of recommended funding and score.

Funding of proposed projects resulting from this solicitation is contingent upon the approval of these projects at a publicly noticed CEC Business Meeting and execution of a grant agreement.
