**MEASURE K: A) AUTHORIZING THE USE OF DISTRICT-DISCRETIONARY MEASURE K FUNDS, NOT TO EXCEED \$160,000 EVENLY SPLIT BETWEEN DISTRICTS 1 AND 3, TO ALLOW THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S OFFICE TO ESTABLISH AND FUND A HUMAN TRAFFICKING CYBERCRIMES UNIT PILOT PROGRAM IN THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S OFFICE; AND
B) AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE HUMAN TRAFFICKING CYBERCRIMES UNIT PILOT PROGRAM AND AUTHORIZING THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY, OR DESIGNEE, TO OVERSEE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PROGRAM**

RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo, State of California, that

WHEREAS, **Measure K** is the half-cent general sales tax initially approved by San Mateo County voters in November 2012 and extended in November 2016 for a total of thirty years; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors (Board) held study sessions on **Measure K** expenditures and approved funds for the fiscal year (FY) 2024-25 budget cycle, divided equally among the five supervisorial districts, for one-time district-discretionary needs and projects; and

WHEREAS, Districts 1 and 3 have requested a one-time \$160,000 allocation of district-discretionary **Measure K** funds (evenly split between Districts 1 and 3) to allow the District Attorney's Office to establish, fund, and implement a Human Trafficking Cybercrimes Unit dedicated exclusively to the identification of human tracking activities

taking place online that can then be brought to full prosecution in San Mateo County;
and

WHEREAS, this item is consistent with the criteria for district-discretionary
Measure K funds approved by the Board in December 2018; and

WHEREAS, there are sufficient **Measure K** funds in the Non-Departmental
Services FY 2024-25 Adopted Budget, and such funds will be rolled forward and
transferred to the District Attorney's Office during the September Revisions process and
included in the FY 2025-26 Adopted Budget.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY DETERMINED AND ORDERED that the
Board of Supervisors approves of said program and use of district-discretionary
Measure K funds.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors authorizes and
approves of the Human Trafficking Cybercrimes Unit Pilot and authorizes the District
Attorney, or designee, to oversee implementation of the program.
