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MEASURE K: A) AUTHORIZING THE USE OF DISTRICT-DISCRETIONARY MEASURE K FUNDS, NOT TO EXCEED \$160,000 EVENLY SPLIT BETWEEN DISTRICTS 1 AND 3, TO ALLOW THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S OFFICE TO ESTABLISH AND FUND A HUMAN TRAFFICKING CYBERCRIMES UNIT PILOT PROGRAM IN THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S OFFICE; AND B) AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE HUMAN TRAFFICKING CYBERCRIMES UNIT PILOT PROGRAM AND AUTHORIZING THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY, OR DESIGNEE, TO OVERSEE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PROGRAM

RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo, State of

California, that

WHEREAS, Measure K is the half-cent general sales tax initially approved by

San Mateo County voters in November 2012 and extended in November 2016 for a total

of thirty years; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors (Board) held study sessions on Measure

K expenditures and approved funds for the fiscal year (FY) 2024-25 budget cycle,

divided equally among the five supervisorial districts, for one-time district-discretionary needs and projects; and

WHEREAS, Districts 1 and 3 have requested a one-time \$160,000 allocation of district-discretionary **Measure K** funds (evenly split between Districts 1 and 3) to allow the District Attorney's Office to establish, fund, and implement a Human Trafficking Cybercrimes Unit dedicated exclusively to the identification of human tracking activities

taking place online that can then be brought to full prosecution in San Mateo County; and

WHEREAS, this item is consistent with the criteria for district-discretionary Measure K funds approved by the Board in December 2018; and

WHEREAS, there are sufficient Measure K funds in the Non-Departmental Services FY 2024-25 Adopted Budget, and such funds will be rolled forward and transferred to the District Attorney's Office during the September Revisions process and included in the FY 2025-26 Adopted Budget.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY DETERMINED AND ORDERED that the Board of Supervisors approves of said program and use of district-discretionary Measure K funds.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors authorizes and approves of the Human Trafficking Cybercrimes Unit Pilot and authorizes the District Attorney, or designee, to oversee implementation of the program.

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
