Servicing 100 clients per organization annually

JobTrain:

- 15 individuals pursued training through the Teamster's Transportation, Distribution, and Logistics (TDL) Apprenticeship Training

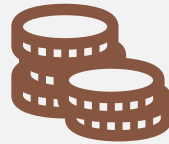

STRUCTURE AND RESOURCES

- City of Half Moon Bay lead agency
- New economic and community vitality division (3.0 FTEs)
- Plan for sustainability to include earned income strategy
- Regional partners
- Local community advisors



PROGRAM DESIGN

- Entrepreneur, small business and job-seeker support
- Co-located business incubator and other support services (i.e., childcare)
- Integration of Chamber's recently launched business development center
- Connection to higher education and trades
- Cultural and language-appropriate services, including for undocumented population



SPACE AND INFRASTRUCTURE

- Physical space to serve as one-stop site for co-located services
- Vacant commercial properties with approximately 3,000 – 4,000 sq. ft.
- Tenant improvements needed, potential donor for support
- City-leased facility



North Fair Oaks Business and Family Center Feasibility Study

NFO Business & Family Resource Center Feasibility Study



Conducted by Renaissance Entrepreneurship Center and Generations United



Completed in early 2022



Process: 31 interviews, survey of 25 businesses



Findings: Strong support for a Business & Family Center

Requested Services for NFO Center

Business Services

- Job Training
- Entrepreneurship training and resources
- Working capital, loans and grants
- Affordable office space
- Business education and training

Community Services

- Better Information about community services
- Navigation assistance
- Co-working space for community organizations
- Community meeting space

EAC Evaluation and Group Learning

- **\$100,000 grant from Chan Zuckerberg Initiative**
 - Evaluate the impacts of the SSF Economic Advancement Center
 - Create a Learning Community for all three sites to share best practices, lessons learned, outreach and contractor management ideas and other suggestions
 - Performance evaluation will be shared with potential future funders

Recommendation: Adopt a Resolution

- (A) Authorizing a total allocation of \$5,000,000 in American Rescue Plan Act (“ARPA”) funds for the development and operation of Economic Advancement Centers in Half Moon Bay (\$2,500,000) and North Fair Oaks (\$2,500,000) to assist local households and small businesses negatively impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic; and
- (B) Authorizing and directing the County Executive, or designee, acting in consultation with the County Attorney’s Office, to negotiate and enter into an agreement with the City of Half Moon Bay for the County’s contribution of \$2,500,000 in ARPA funds to support two years of operation of a Coastside Economic Advancement Center; and
- (C) Approving an Appropriation Transfer Request (“ATR”) in the amount of \$500,000, recognizing unanticipated revenue from the Chan Zuckerberg Initiative grant through the Silicon Valley Community Foundation to Non-Departmental Services to supplement funding for the North Fair Oaks Economic Advancement Center.
