RESOLUTION HONORING AND COMMENDING

Senator Scott Wiener

as representative of California’s 11th Senate District

WHEREAS, beginning his public service career in 2002 as a Deputy City Attorney in the San Francisco City Attorney’s Office, **Senator Scott Wiener** was later elected by the voters to serve as a member of the San Francisco County Board of Supervisors in 2010, and chaired the San Francisco County Transportation Authority; and

WHEREAS, during his tenure as a Supervisor, **Senator Scott Wiener** authored several first-in-the-nation measures, including mandating fully paid parental leave for all working parents, requiring water recycling and solar power in new developments, as well as housing and public transportation policies to expedite approval of affordable housing, while also tethering public transportation funding to population growth; and

WHEREAS, **Senator Scott Wiener** was elected to California’s 11th Senate District in 2016, which includes all of San Francisco, the communities of Broadmoor, Colma, and Daly City, and parts of South San Francisco and San Bruno; and

WHEREAS, **Senator Scott Wiener** has authored numerous bills that were signed into law with substantial improvements for California residents on topics such as housing, transportation, mental health, civil rights and poverty, criminal justice reform, clean energy, technology, public safety, and LGBTQ issues; and

WHEREAS, for over 9 years, **Senator Scott Wiener** has vigorously represented the residents of the counties of San Mateo and San Francisco, and as Chair of the Senate Budget Committee, has been a leading voice on state finances, championing historic investments in housing, public safety, education, transportation, environmental protections, and anti-discrimination measures; and

WHEREAS, after being appointed to the Chair of the Senate Budget Committee in 2025, **Senator Scott Wiener** was instrumental in securing \$215,162,553 million in Vehicle Licensing Fee shortfall funding for the 20 municipalities of San Mateo County and the County of San Mateo, which has helped maintain essential county services, including homeless shelter operations, housing subsidies, farmworker housing, climate change and sea level rise initiatives, and wildfire prevention efforts.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo, State of California, hereby honors and commends **Senator Scott Wiener** for his service, leadership, and tireless dedication to San Mateo County.
