WHEREAS, Teresa Kurtak attended a farming conference in Pacific Grove in 2006, where she met Mike Irving and soon partnered to run a small diverse farm in Santa Cruz; and

WHEREAS, Teresa Kurtak thoroughly enjoyed her academic work, but ultimately discovered that there is nothing quite so satisfying as being a farmer; and

**WHEREAS, Teresa Kurtak** with Mike Irving and John Vars, in 2008, launched Fifth Crow Farm in Pescadero, a new farming operation built from scratch on a shoestring budget, big dreams and sore muscles that is rooted in a values-based approach to land stewardship, sustainable food systems and a vision for a viable future for local agriculture.
