### **BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, COUNTY OF SAN MATEO, STATE OF CALIFORNIA**

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**RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ACCEPTANCE OF AN AWARD FROM, AND ENTERING INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH, THE CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH SEXUALLY TRANSMITTED DISEASES CONTROL BRANCH TO DEVELOP, EXPAND, TRAIN AND SUSTAIN THE DISEASE INTERVENTION SPECIALIST WORKFORCE, FOR THE TERM OF JULY 1, 2025 THROUGH DECEMBER 31, 2030, IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$887,652**

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**RESOLVED**, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo, State of California, that

**WHEREAS**, The California Department of Public Health has awarded the County \$887,652 through a grant agreement to develop, train and sustain the County's disease intervention specialist workforce; and

**WHEREAS**, there has been presented to this Board of Supervisors for its consideration and acceptance an agreement with the California Department of Public Health, reference to which is hereby made for further particulars, whereby the San Mateo County Sexually Transmitted Disease (STD) program shall receive funding to provide STD program management and collaboration; and,

**WHEREAS**, the County intends to conduct activities necessary to develop, expand, train, and sustain a response-ready disease intervention specialist workforce, and

**WHEREAS**, the term of the agreement is July 1, 2025 through December 31, 2030, in an amount not to exceed \$887,652; and

**WHEREAS**, this Board has been presented with the agreement and has examined and approved it as to both form and content and desires to enter into the agreement.

**NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY DETERMINED AND ORDERED** that the President of this Board of Supervisors be and is hereby authorized and directed to execute said agreement for and on behalf of the County of San Mateo, and the Clerk of the Board shall attest the President's signature thereto.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Chief of San Mateo County Health or her designee is authorized to execute contract amendments which modify the County's maximum fiscal obligation by no more than \$25,000 (in aggregate), and/or modify the contract term and/or services so long as the modified term or services is/are within the current or revised fiscal provisions.

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
