BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, COUNTY OF SAN MATEO, STATE OF CALIFORNIA

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RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AN AGREEMENT WITH RASH CURTIS AND ASSOCIATES FOR SELF-PAY PATIENT BAD DEBT ACCOUNT SERVICES FOR THE TERM OF AUGUST 1, 2019 THROUGH JULY 31, 2022, FOR AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$750,000

RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo, State of California, that

WHEREAS, San Mateo Medical Center (SMMC) provides medical services to the County's safety net population, and many of those services are supported by state and federal funding sources; and

WHEREAS, SMMC completed a Request for Proposals for a vendor to provide self-pay patient bad debt collection services in May 2019 and Rash Curtis and Associates (Rash Curtis) was chosen for, among other reasons, its specialized experience in self-pay bad debt accounts and its enhanced technology and analytic capabilities; and

WHEREAS, Rash Curtis will replace the County of San Mateo's Revenue Services division as exclusive vendor for the bad debt accounts; and

WHEREAS, contracting with Rash Curtis will allow SMMC to align the bad debt collection services with the pre-bad debt collection services as part of a two-prong strategy to improve self-pay collections; and

WHEREAS, Rash Curtis and the County wish enter into an agreement for bad debt cash collections for the term of August 1, 2019 through July 31, 2022 for an amount not to exceed \$750,000; and

WHEREAS, this Board has been presented with a form of such agreement, has examined and approved it as both form and content, and desires to enter into it.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY DETERMINED AND ORDERED that the President of the Board of Supervisors be and is hereby authorized and directed to execute said agreement for and on behalf of the County of San Mateo, and the Clerk of the Board shall attest the President's signature thereto.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chief of San Mateo County Health or designee is authorized to execute contract amendments which modify the County's maximum fiscal obligation by no more than \$25,000 (in aggregate) and/or modify the contract term and/or services so long as the modified term or services is/are within the current or revised fiscal provisions.

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
