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**RESOLUTION SUPPORTING AN APPLICATION TO THE SAN MATEO COUNTY
TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY FOR CYCLE 7 PEDESTRIAN AND BICYCLE
PROGRAM FUNDING FOR THE PROJECT APPROVAL AND ENVIRONMENTAL
DOCUMENT PHASE OF THE ALPINE ROAD CORRIDOR IMPROVEMENT
PROJECT**

RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo, State of California, that

WHEREAS, the County of San Mateo Department of Public Works (Department/Sponsor) has identified roadway improvements to the Alpine Road Corridor to improve safety for drivers, bicyclists, and pedestrians using the corridor; and

WHEREAS, the Sponsor has developed the Alpine Road Corridor Improvement Project (Project) with limits from the County limit approximately 1,500 feet south of Junipero Serra Boulevard to the County limit approximately 1,000 feet south of La Mesa Drive to reduce congestion and improve traffic operations, bicycle and pedestrian access, and connectivity; and

WHEREAS, on November 15, 2022, by Resolution No. 079319, this Board of Supervisors directed the Department to submit a funding request application for the San Mateo County Transportation Authority (SMCTA) 2022 Measure A and Measure W Pedestrian and Bicycle Program Call for Projects to support the implementation of the Project's Project Initiation Phase (PID); and

WHEREAS, the Department was successful in receiving grant funding from the SMCTA for the PID phase of the Project, which phase is currently underway; and

WHEREAS, once the PID has been completed, the Project Approval and Environmental Document (PA&ED) is the next phase in this Project and is estimated to cost \$2,145,000; and

WHEREAS, the SMCTA issued a Call for Projects for the Cycle 7 Pedestrian and Bicycle Program Funding, on June 10, 2024; and

WHEREAS, the Department is recommending submission of a grant application to SMCTA's Cycle 7 Pedestrian and Bicycle Program Funding in the amount of \$1,950,000 for the PA&ED phase of the Project; and

WHEREAS, for acceptance of a grant application, the SMCTA requires an executed resolution stating the following:

1. Supporting the Project and application for \$1,950,000 in SMCTA Cycle 7 Pedestrian and Bicycle Program, funded through the SMCTA's Measure A and W funds for Project; and
2. Committing the Sponsor to complete the Project, including the commitment of matching funds in the amount of \$195,000 needed for implementation; and
3. Certifying that any funds awarded by the SMCTA will be used to supplement existing funds for program activities and will not replace existing funds or resources; and
4. If funds are awarded, authorizing the Public Works Director, or designee, to sign a funding agreement or memorandum of understanding (MOU) with the SMCTA for SMCTA Measures A and W Pedestrian and Bicycle Program funding for the Project and to take any other actions necessary to give effect to this resolution and execute applicable amendments.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY DETERMINED AND ORDERED that the

Board of Supervisors:

1. Directs the Department to submit an application to the San Mateo County Transportation Authority for Cycle 7 Measure A and W Pedestrian and Bicycle Program funds for \$1,950,000 for the Alpine Road Corridor Improvement Project.
2. Authorizes the Public Works Director, or designee, to execute a funding agreement or MOU with the San Mateo County Transportation Authority to encumber SMCTA Cycle 7 Measures A and W Pedestrian and Bicycle Program funds.
3. Commits to completing the Project, including contributing \$195,000 of matching funds needed for Project implementation, if the requested San Mateo County Transportation Authority funds are awarded.
4. Certifies that any funds awarded by the San Mateo County Transportation Authority will be used to supplement existing funds for program activities and will not replace existing funds or resources.
5. Authorizes the Public Works Director, or designee, to take any other actions necessary to give effect to this resolution and execute applicable amendments.

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
