- 1 year grant closing June 30, 2025
- \$490,000

# Grant Project Priorities

1. Build an equity data portal utilizing a shared prosperity framework
2. Design a structure to ensure quality community research, analysis, and data stewardship, and
3. Deepen support for the implementation and development of the 3.0 and 4.0 Countywide Equity Action Plan
4. Bring technical expertise to identify improvement opportunities to public grantmaking efforts such as Measure K
5. Retain project management support to achieve the aforementioned projects.

- Support data-driven decision making centering an understanding of equity issues in San Mateo County.

- **Challenge:**

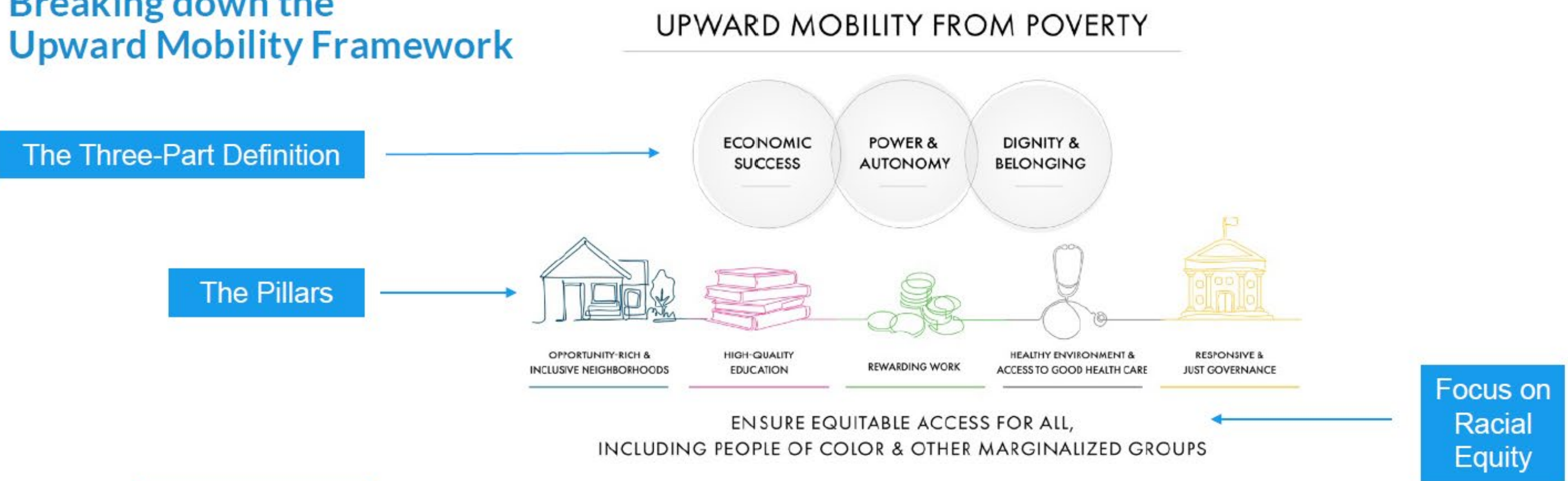
- Equity-focused data for San Mateo County is found across numerous data portals based on sector-specific interests.

- **Path Forward:**

- Develop an equity-focused data portal available through the County organized by community priorities and priorities identified in a national analysis for economic mobility

# Community Data Stewardship

## **Goal:**

- Ensure data collected from the community, especially our most impacted communities, are honored and maximized to influence and inform County decisions across departments.

## **Challenge:**

- Bringing an equity lens into County operations requires expanding opportunities for community to bring voice to County planning decision-making processes. Yet, without careful consideration and resources in place, the data collected from the community may not be utilized to its full potential.
- The County includes over 25 departments and innumerable initiatives, many of which are running simultaneously.
- Community engagement efforts are often facilitated by different implementing entities, from departmental staff to academic institutions and consultants.
- This model presents several challenges for effective stewardship of the community data

## **Path Forward:**

- Understand the community data needs across departments
- Identify strengths, limitations, and priorities for community data
- Identify strategies to improve coordination, data collection, data storage, and analysis



# TA for Countywide Equity Action Plan

- **Goal:**

- Strengthen the existing Countywide Equity Action Planning process and implementation.

- **Challenge:**

- Capacity to deepen actions and track progress with the Countywide Equity Action Plan, a critical structure for advancing equity across departments.

- **Path:**

- Bring expertise to build additional capacity within the County and in departments to expand and deepen strategies to advance equity within and across departments.

# TA to Learn from Measure K Process

- **Goal:**

- Continue to strengthen Measure K allocation process.

- **Challenge:**

- New strategies/efforts can benefit from an analysis of process efficacy and best practice research.

- **Path:**

- Bring on expertise to identify best practices around developing public contracting process, driven by community and Board priorities, within the context of San Mateo County.
