Background & Partnership Overview







- Sheriff's Office has partnered with the Transit District for 23 years since 2002.
- 20-hour contract
- 77 miles of track, 32 stations
- 76 bus routes throughout San Mateo County and into parts of San Francisco and Palo Alto
- Services: patrols, investigations, rapid response, high visibility, and special events (i.e. Giants games, Bay 2 Breakers).
- Strong collaboration with SamTrans and Caltrain ensuring safe and reliable transit.

Impact & Outcomes

- Established positive working relationships between deputies and conductors and bus operators during high visibility enforcement.
- Increased safety visibility enhances community confidence

The personnel costs for FY25-26 totals \$6,875,608. Operating costs of \$1,857,595 and the augmented services (supplemental overtime for special events) totaling \$900,000 brings the overall adjusted cost of basic law enforcement services to \$9,633,203.

This amount has been included in the Sheriff's Office FY2025-26 budget.

Recommendation & Next Steps

- Renew agreement to ensure continuity of law enforcement services through 2030.
- Maintain safety, reliability, and trust across the transit system.
- Strengthen interagency collaboration between SamTrans, Caltrain, and the Sheriff's Office.
- Recommended Action: Approve the contract amendment and extension.
