4.42% of students in California are homeschooled.

The number of homeschooled and online schooled students in California increased by 78% between 2017 and 2022.

Homeschool students in California are currently unable to participate in the highly beneficial extracurricular activities provided by public schools, such as performing arts or sports.



**RESOLUTION SUPPORTING EQUITABLE ACCESS TO EXTRACURRICULAR
ACTIVITIES FOR HOMESCHOOLED AND ONLINE-SCHOOLED STUDENTS**

WHEREAS, extracurricular activities, including sports, arts, and music programs, provide significant physical, emotional, and social benefits to youth; and

WHEREAS, access to these activities supports student development, academic success, and overall well-being; and

WHEREAS, the number of homeschooled and online-schooled students in California has increased significantly in recent years, with a 78 percent increase between 2017 and 2022; and

WHEREAS, despite paying local and state taxes, homeschooled and online-schooled students are often not permitted to participate in extracurricular activities offered by school districts; and
