BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, COUNTY OF SAN MATEO, STATE OF CALIFORNIA

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RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE PILOT REWARD PROGRAM FOR INFORMATION ON RESIDENTIAL BURGLARY CRIMES IN SAN MATEO COUNTY SUPERVISORIAL DISTRICT 3, AND AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE OR DESIGNEE, TO IMPLEMENT THE REWARD PROGRAM, INCLUDING PAYING QUALIFYING REWARDS, AS NECESSARY AND ADVISABLE WITHIN THE DISCRETION OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE, IN COORDINATION WITH THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY AND SHERIFF

RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo, State of California, that

WHEREAS, Measure K is the half-cent general sales tax initially approved by San Mateo County voters in November 2012, and extended in November 2016 for a total of thirty years; and

WHEREAS, the Board and County staff have conducted study sessions and community outreach efforts to inform priorities for **Measure K** spending; and

WHEREAS, the Board has held study sessions on **Measure K** expenditures and anticipated revenue for fiscal years (FY) 2023-25, and has approved funds, divided equally among the supervisorial districts, for one-time district-discretionary needs and projects; and

WHEREAS, Supervisorial District 3 has requested an Appropriation Transfer Request (ATR) transferring \$125,000 of its district-discretionary funds, to the County Executive's Office to establish and fund a Pilot Reward Program for Information on Residential Burglary Crimes in San Mateo County Supervisorial District 3 (Reward

Program), administered in coordination with the San Mateo County District Attorney and Sheriff; and

WHEREAS, the Board wishes to authorize the use of **Measure K** funds to establish, on a pilot basis, the Reward Program, and to authorize the County Executive, or designee, to implement the Reward Program, including by paying qualifying rewards, as necessary and advisable within the discretion of the County Executive, in coordination with the District Attorney and Sheriff; and

WHEREAS, this item is consistent with the criteria for district-discretionary **Measure K** funds approved by the Board in December 2018; and

WHEREAS, there are sufficient **Measure K** funds in the Non-Departmental Services FY 2023-24 Adopted Budget.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY DETERMINED AND ORDERED that the Board of Supervisors authorizes and approves the Reward Program, and authorizes and directs the County Executive, or designee, to develop and implement the Reward Program, including by paying qualifying rewards, as necessary and advisable within the discretion of the County Executive, in coordination with the District Attorney and Sheriff.

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
