- 24. Adopt a resolution authorizing and directing the Director of Department of Housing, or

designee, to execute an agreement with Our Common Ground, Inc. to lease County owned property located at 750 El Camino Real in Belmont ("Property") for a monthly payment of \$100 and for a term of two years from the date of execution of the agreement, with an option to extend the term an additional two years, provided that the Property is used and occupied only for therapeutic community residential care for persons with substance abuse history and for no other purpose without the County's prior written consent.

If e-mailed comments are received after 5:00p.m. on the day before the meeting, the Clerk will make every effort to either (i) provide such e-mailed comments to the Board and make such e-mails publicly available on the agenda website prior to the meeting, or (ii) read such emails during the meeting. Whether such e-mailed comments are forwarded and posted, or are read during the meeting, they will still be included in the administrative record.
