

## In favor of "Commissioner Espinoza Map"

Dear members of the Board of Supervisors,

As a long-time Coastsider and former member of the San Mateo County Transit District Board of Directors, I believe Commissioner Espinosa's map makes the most sense for the following reasons:

- 1. The City of Pacifica has much more in common with District 5 than with District 3. Indeed, Pacifica shares the Jefferson Elementary School District with District 5.
- 2. The transportation needs and interests of Pacifica are far more closely aligned with those of District 5 and North County than they are with the District 3 region south of Devil's Slide.
- 3. Perhaps of greatest importance, the Espinosa Map gathers several disadvantaged communities (North Fair Oaks, East Palo Alto) into District 3 which has historically been lacking in communities of color.

#### For these reasons, I respectfully ask that you vote in favor of Commissioner Espinosa's Map.

And in the event that additional maps are drafted, I want to express my adamant opposition to carving up the Coastside south of Devil's Slide into different Supervisorial Districts. That portion of the Coastside must remain united in one District.
