My name is Ever Rodriguez. I am part of the North Fair Oaks Community Council. Today I urge you to vote in favor of divesting the San Mateo Investment Pool fund from fossil fuel companies, including the 50 million dollars in Chevron and Exxon bonds.

Voting to divest away from fossil fuel companies would make San Mateo County a leader in climate action and to support and defend our environment.

Divesting the investment pool fund from fossil fuels would build upon an established and already successful trend of divestment of fossil fuels in educational institutions, cultural and religious organizations, nonprofits and for-profit corporations and groups — and other government bodies, such as our county.
