Board of Supervisors, Mr. Pine, Mr. Mueller and Ms. Stillman,

A quick heads-up that I plan to make public comments at the 11/14 BOS meeting related to the inaction and general lack of urgency you all have demonstrated related to the repairs on the Sawyer Camp section of the Crystal Springs Regional Trail.

Specifically:

- It has been 10 months since the actual damage and 6 months since this item was even referenced in a BOS meeting
- The site: <a href="https://www.smcgov.org/parks/news/CSRT-2023-closures">https://www.smcgov.org/parks/news/CSRT-2023-closures</a> is unspecific and provides no detailed plans, update on progress or estimated date to re-open this key public resource
- In contrast, during this time:
  - Nearly \$500M in public works contracts have been awarded and approved
  - Demolition of the site and the key structural components of a massive tech park on Rollins Road across from the Millbrae train station has been constructed
  - Burlingame has completely rerouted traffic, repaved, added bike lanes and reconfigured California Street

The last mention of this project in May 2023 indicated the following... "WHEREAS, the Department understands the impacts to the local communities and streamlining the projects will allow for the quickest path forward to recover from the 2022-2023 winter storms;"

I find that you have not lived up to this understanding, nor have you provided the public with any reasonable information about progress and expectations, while other priorities seem to move forward.

I propose that you all should be more accountable to 1) transparency about progress (or lack thereof) and 2) an actual date when the Sawyer Camp section will reopen. While I am glad the Lower Crystal Springs Dam Bridge (where Ms. Stillman walks – according to the announcement of her appointment on the SMC site) is open, those of us who live near the Sawyer Camp section are not so lucky.

Please do better for us. Thanks.

I live in Belmont and I am a client of housing choices and ggrc. This project is crucial for my community and aligns with our urgent need for affordable housing for vulnerable populations- like those with intellectual or developmental disabilities (IDD). The project aims to provide 70 units of affordable housing, with approximately 35 units specifically for the IDD community. Novin Development, the project's developer, plans to offer a mix of one and two-bedroom units at 40% Area Median Income (AMI) and below for the IDD population. Additionally, they are offering 30% to 80% AMI units for workforce housing, solidifying its status as a truly inclusive housing project. Because households with at least one member with a disability are more likely to be extremely low income than households that don't include people with disabilities, these units are crucial in housing those that may be homeless or living in an uncomfortable or even unsafe environment due to their disability. Housing for people with developmental disabilities is important to me because people with disabilities will need to support themselves in the long haul and feature as for me i was blessed to move into firehouse square so I would be able to live on my own with housing choices help along the way For these reasons, I support this project and urge the County Board of Supervisors to take the necessary actions to bring this project to reality and make it a blessing for many people with disabilities i believe that this project's is focusing on serving IDD households will significantly contribute to the County's goal of meeting the 5% homeless preference threshold. Your dedication to ensuring individuals with developmental disabilities have access to the safe and inclusive housing they rightfully deserve is truly commendable. My name is Dr. Jennnifer Johnson, and I live and vote in District 3.

I am writing in support of Special Olympics Northern California's (SONC) request for a Measure K funding allocation of \$75,000. These funds would go to support activities like the 2024 Basketball Invitational, the Menlo Games, and to recruit new athletes and volunteer coaches. SONC provides a large variety of sports programs over the course of each year to support every athlete. SONC provides social opportunities and exercise for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities, both of which lead to better health outcomes and decrease need for costly emergency services.

There is real need for activities for children and adults with intellectual and other disabilities across our county. Most private programs, and – disappointingly – many city and public programs, do not meet the needs of disabled community members. San Mateo County does not have any adaptive sports or therapeutic recreation programs in the whole county. Because of this, I, myself, have developed programs within my community to serve some of that need, but such programs are small and costly and financially out of reach for many families who have a member with a disability. You have a remarkable opportunity to support one of the few organizations providing recreation, socialization, and exercise for this underserved community at no cost to participants. With increasing rates of obesity and diabetes, this is a huge amount of prevention for what could be the cost of a single Emergency Room visit. It is hard to imagine a more cost effective way to improve health and happiness for a community.

People with disabilities very often do not receive the representation from their local government that they deserve. This is a moment to show this community that you care and value them. The requested funding from Measure K allows SONC to continue its work in each one of your Districts. I support their request and hope you vote to continue the County's support for children and adults with disabilities.
