Dear Supervisors,

I am writing regarding the County mental health pilot project to urge you to consider a well-documented and proven model for mental health emergency response called CAHOOTS. I understand you are aware of the model.

While I support your efforts to reimagine emergency mental health response, keeping the program under the police management is simply not the solution we need. This program should be housed under San Mateo County Health, working in conjunction with 911 emergency response, as Eugene, Oregon does.

Also, we understand that there is only going to be one mental health professional for each pilot city. That is not going to provide what is needed to staff a 24/7 program. Mental health crises do not fall within an 8 hour shift.

Please revise your pilot program to really give it the best chance to succeed.
