
California Microbusiness COVID-19 Relief Grant Program

Recommendation to:

- a) Approve an Appropriation Transfer Request (ATR) accepting unanticipated revenue in the amount of \$964,630 to fund the California Microbusiness COVID-19 Relief Grant Program; and
- b) Adopt a resolution ratifying grant agreement with the State of California for the California Microbusiness COVID-19 Relief Grant Program and directing the County to administer the California Microbusiness COVID-19 Relief Grant Program in San Mateo County, in partnership with Renaissance Entrepreneurship Center, as well as other community partners.



Background

- Established to assist microbusinesses significantly impacted by the pandemic
- Provide relief to hardest to reach microbusinesses and entrepreneurs
- Award amount based on County population
- Funding will provide 309 grants in the amount of \$2,500 to eligible microbusiness owners in San Mateo County





Microbusiness Eligibility Criteria

- Meet criteria of qualified microbusiness owner
- Microbusiness was owner's primary source of income in 2019
- Has not received a grant under the California Small Business COVID-19 Relief
 Grant Program
- Active business since at least December 2019
- Experienced significant impact by COVID-19 pandemic
- Less than fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) in revenues in 2019
- Fewer than five full time equivalent employees
