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**RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE MIDCOASTSIDE TRANSPORTATION DEMAND
MANAGEMENT PLAN AND SUBMITTING AN APPLICATION TO THE SAN MATEO
COUNTY TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY FOR MEASURE A ALTERNATIVE
CONGESTION RELIEF AND MEASURE W TRANSPORTATION DEMAND
MANAGEMENT PROGRAM FUNDING**

RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo, State of California, that

WHEREAS, the County of San Mateo’s Energy Efficiency Climate Action Plan (EECAP) found that the transportation sector accounts for over 60 percent of all emissions in the county; and

WHEREAS, the EECAP identified transportation demand management (TDM) measures as necessary to reduce Vehicle Miles Traveled (VMT) in order to achieve greenhouse gas emission reduction goals; and

WHEREAS, San Mateo County’s unincorporated coastside communities generate higher VMT compared to other jurisdictions in San Mateo County; and

WHEREAS, the County of San Mateo Local Coastal Program Policy 2.52 requires certain applicants for new development to develop and implement a traffic impact analysis and mitigation plan that includes TDM measures; and

WHEREAS, the County of San Mateo Planning and Building Department (Department) developed a draft San Mateo County Midcoast Comprehensive Transportation Management Plan (“CTMP,” referred to as “Connect the Coastside”) to improve safety and mobility and address the requirements of County Local Coastal Program Policy 2.53; and

WHEREAS, Connect the Coastside identifies the importance of TDM as a congestion reduction strategy and recommends identifying and implementing additional TDM strategies; and

WHEREAS, the unincorporated San Mateo County Midcoast, including the communities of Montara, Moss Beach, Princeton, El Granada, and Miramar, requires specific TDM strategies due to its unique nature, including limited transportation access, low density land use pattern, and high rates of tourism; and

WHEREAS, the Department (Sponsor) has identified the need to develop and implement TDM strategies for the Midcoast in collaboration with partners, such as the City of Half Moon Bay, to address challenges and maximize success; and

WHEREAS, the Sponsor seeks to develop a Midcoastside Transportation Demand Management Plan (Project) in collaboration with the City of Half Moon Bay to recommend TDM strategies tailored to the Midcoast; and

WHEREAS, the Sponsor or City of Half Moon Bay will be the lead implementing agency for the development of the Project; and

WHEREAS, the total Project scope will be \$220,000 in partnership with the City of Half Moon Bay; and

WHEREAS, it will cost \$110,000 to implement the Sponsor's portion of the Project scope; and

WHEREAS, the Sponsor seeks \$100,000 for the Project; and

WHEREAS, the San Mateo County Transportation Authority (TA) issued a Call for Projects for the Measure A Alternative Congestion Relief and Measure W Transportation Demand Management (ACR/TDM) Program on April 7, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the TA requires a resolution from the Sponsor's governing body:

1. Supporting the Project and application for \$100,000 in TA ACR/TDM Program funds for Project, and
2. Committing the Sponsor to the completion of the Project, including the commitment of matching funds in the amount of \$10,000 needed for implementation, and

3. Certifying that any funds awarded by the San Mateo County Transportation Authority will be used to supplement existing funds for program activities, and will not replace existing funds or resources, and
4. Authorizing the Community Development Director, or designee, to sign a funding agreement with the TA and City of Half Moon Bay, if funds are awarded, for TA ACR/TDM Program funding for the Project and to take any other actions necessary to give effect to this resolution, and
5. Committing to commence work on the Project, if awarded, within one year of the TA Board of Directors allocating 2022 ACR/TDM Program funding and

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY DETERMINED AND ORDERED that the Board of Supervisors of San Mateo County:

1. Directs staff to submit an application for TA ACR/TDM Program funds for \$100,000 for the Midcoastside Transportation Demand Management Plan.
2. Authorizes the Community Development Director, or designee, to execute a funding agreement with the TA to encumber any ACR/TDM Program funds awarded.

3. Commits to the completion of the Project, including the commitment of \$10,000 of matching funds needed for implementation, if awarded the requested TA funds.
4. Certifies that any funds awarded by the TA will be used to supplement existing funds for the Project, and will not replace existing funds or resources.
5. Commits to commencing work on the Project, if awarded, within one year of the TA Board of Directors allocating the 2022 ACR/TDM Program funds.
6. Authorizes the Community Development Director to take any other actions necessary to give effect to this resolution.

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
