FLOOD PARK-TREE PRESERVATION



TREE PRESERVATION:

Compared with the 2020 landscape plan and tree removals in the EIR the updated plan would preserve:

28 Significant Trees (12" DBH or greater)

Native Oak Trees: +18
Native Trees (non-oak): +5
Non-Native Trees: +5

Projected Tree Removals associated with the updated plan include:

(0) Heritage Trees

21 Significant Trees (12" DBH or greater)

- (5) Significant Oak Trees
- (0) Significant Native Trees (non-oak)
- (16) Significant Non-Native Trees

43 Other Trees (less than 12")


- (5) Native Oak Trees
- (0) Native Trees (non-oak)
- (38) Non-Native Trees

TOTAL TREES TO BE REMOVED: 64

Note: There are an additional 32 trees that need to be removed due to poor health and condition. Removal of these trees is unrelated to the Realize Flood Park Project. These tree removals are included in the diagram.
