The San Mateo County Navigation Center, located at 275 Blomquist Road, Redwood City, CA (formerly known as 1450 or 1469 Maple Street, Redwood City, CA) will provide 240 safe, temporary living units and intensive on-site support services to individuals and couples experiencing homelessness. The Center will be comprised of an array of multiple prefabricated modular units arrayed and stacked on the property, two site-constructed buildings, and outdoor landscaped and shared amenity space. Services will be client-centered and include intensive housing focused case management with the goal of moving people into permanent housing. The Center will also have low entry barriers, increased privacy for clients and space for couples to stay together. The Navigation Center is a key component of the County plan to offer every unsheltered person who chooses assistance a shelter in an emergency shelter or in temporary or permanent housing. Site features include 68 parking spaces, 7 electric vehicle spaces, 140 bicycles, and an all-electric commercial kitchen that will offer teaching and rehabilitation services to center clients.

Consistent with the directed purpose of the award as stated in the Joint Explanatory Statement (JES), Community Project Funding (CPF) funds, in the amount of \$500,000, will be used solely for furnishings for the Center.

A line-item Project Budget for the entire project, including a sub-budget that addresses the CPF portion (furnishings) of the budget only, is included in the submission packet. No indirect costs are being charged to the CPF grant funds.

- 12. Will comply with the provisions of the Hatch Act (5 U.S.C. §§1501-1508 and 7324-7328) which limit the political activities of employees whose principal employment activities are funded in whole or in part with Federal funds.
- 13. Will comply, as applicable, with the provisions of the Davis-Bacon Act (40 U.S.C. §§276a to 276a-7), the Copeland Act (40 U.S.C. §276c and 18 U.S.C. §874), and the Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act (40 U.S.C. §§327-333) regarding labor standards for federally-assisted construction subagreements.

- Will comply with the Wild and Scenic Rivers Act of 1968 (16 U.S.C. §§1271 et seq.) related to protecting components or potential components of the national wild and scenic rivers system.
- 17. Will assist the awarding agency in assuring compliance with Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966, as amended (16 U.S.C. §470), EO 11593 (identification and protection of historic properties), and the Archaeological and Historic Preservation Act of 1974 (16 U.S.C. §§469a-1 et seq).
- 18. Will cause to be performed the required financial and compliance audits in accordance with the Single Audit Act Amendments of 1996 and OMB Circular No. A-133, "Audits of States, Local Governments, and Non-Profit Organizations."
- Will comply with all applicable requirements of all other Federal laws, executive orders, regulations, and policies governing this program.
- 20. Will comply with the requirements of Section 106(g) of the Trafficking Victims Protection Act (TVPA) of 2000, as amended (22 U.S.C. 7104) which prohibits grant award recipients or a sub-recipient from (1) Engaging in severe forms of trafficking in persons during the period of time that the award is in effect (2) Procuring a commercial sex act during the period of time that the award is in effect or (3) Using forced labor in the performance of the award or subawards under the award.
