BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, COUNTY OF SAN MATEO, STATE OF CALIFORNIA

RESOLUTION RATIFYING AND EXTENDING PROCLAMATION OF LOCAL EMERGENCY

**RESOLVED,** by the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo, State of California, that

WHEREAS, Government Code Section 8630 and Chapter 2.46 of the San Mateo County Ordinance Code authorize the Director of Emergency Services ("Director") of the County of San Mateo ("County") to proclaim a local emergency when the County is threatened by conditions of disaster or extreme peril to the safety of persons and property within the County that are or are likely to be beyond the control of the services, personnel, equipment and facilities of the County and require the combined forces of other political subdivisions to combat and the Board of Supervisors is not in session; and

WHEREAS, on January 2, 2023, the Director proclaimed a local emergency based on conditions of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property within San Mateo County due to the damage and impacts resulting from the extreme and unprecedented levels of rainfall and associated severe weather over the last several days and a copy of the Director's January 2, 2023 proclamation is Exhibit A to this resolution; and

WHEREAS, under Section 8630 of the Government Code, the local emergency set forth in the Director's proclamation shall not remain in effect for more than seven days unless ratified by the Board of Supervisors; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Supervisors hereby finds that there continue to exist within the County conditions of disaster or extreme peril to the safety of persons and property that are beyond the control of the services, personnel, equipment, and facilities of the County, for the reasons set forth in Exhibit A.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY DETERMINED AND ORDERED that the local emergency proclaimed by the Director on January 2, 2023 is hereby ratified.

Under Government Code Section 8630, the Board of Supervisors shall review the need for continuing the local emergency at least once every 60 days until this Board terminates the local emergency.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Board of Supervisors delegates authority to the Director to terminate the local emergency, pursuant to Section 8630 of the Government Code, at the earliest possible date that conditions warrant.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that any orders previously issued by the Director under the authority set forth in the Government Code or in Chapter 2.46 of the San Mateo County Ordinance Code shall remain in place and in effect until duly rescinded or until the date that this local emergency is terminated, whichever first occurs.

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
