


FY 2023-25 Budget Overview

- Re-establishing the County Emergency Response Coordinators meetings




PRIORITIES

- Development of the All-Hazards Evacuation Plan
- Public Preparedness
 - Community outreach events
 - North Fair Oaks Personal Safety Preparedness Day (July 15th, 2023)
 - 19th Annual SMC Disaster Preparedness Day (August 5th, 2023)
 - Establish MOUs with NGOs, CBOs, and Faith-based organization







CHALLENGES

- EOC training for County staff
 - Identify 2-year commitment for trained staff
- More outreach needed
 - o Social Media
- Infrastructure, communications, and internet access on the Coastside
- Understanding differences in communication between rural and urban areas of the County



DEPARTMENT PERFORMANCE & IMPROVEMENTS

EQUITY:

- Identify and utilize DSWs who are multilingual that can work in the EOC and the field
- SMC Alert is multilingual and sends alerts in three languages
- Participate with local NGOs, CBOs, and nonprofits to understand community needs

PERFORMANCE MEASURES:

- Goal of 310 County staff trained to work in the EOC by FY 2024-25
- Goal of 150,000 registered recipients on SMC Alert by FY 2024-25
