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**RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AN AGREEMENT WITH PENINSULA UROLOGY, LLC
TO PROVIDE ONSITE LASER EQUIPMENT, SUPPLIES, AND TECHNICIAN
SERVICES FOR THE TERM OF OCTOBER 1, 2017 THROUGH SEPTEMBER 30,
2020, TO AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$1,219,176**

RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo, State of California, that

WHEREAS, San Mateo Medical Center (SMMC) has a continuous need for both sonic and laser equipment used in the treatment of urology ailments such as kidney or bladder stones or strictures; and

WHEREAS, SMMC and Peninsula Urology, LLC (Peninsula Urology) wish to enter into an agreement whereby Peninsula Urology will provide portable laser equipment, supplies, and technician services to meet SMMC's needs for the term of October 1, 2017 through September 30, 2020, to an amount not to exceed \$1,219,176; and

WHEREAS, Peninsula Urology is the sole provider of on premise leased laser equipment in the area, and SMMC is requesting that this Board waive the Request for Proposals process; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance Code Section 2.83.170 authorizes the Board of Supervisors to waive the RFP process in any situation where the Board of Supervisors determines that the best interest of the County could be served without the necessity of

a proposal; and

WHEREAS, this Board has been presented with a form of such agreement, has examined and approved it as to both form and content, and desires to enter into it.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED that the RFP process for said agreement is hereby waived.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the President of this Board of Supervisors be and is hereby authorized and directed to execute said agreement for and on behalf of the County of San Mateo, and the Clerk of the Board shall attest the President's signature thereto.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chief of the Health System or designee is authorized to execute contract amendments which modify the County's maximum fiscal obligation by no more than \$25,000 (in aggregate), and/or modify the contract term and/or services so long as the modified term or services is/are within the current or revised fiscal provisions.

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
