RESOLUTION APPROVING \$78,700 IN GRANTS OF MEASURE K FUNDS TO SUPPORT CITIES' PARTICIPATION IN THE HOME FOR ALL COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT PILOT PROJECT PROGRAM, AS FOLLOWS: \$12,500 FOR BURLINGAME; \$23,200 FOR HALF MOON BAY; \$23,000 FOR PORTOLA VALLEY; AND \$20,000 FOR REDWOOD CITY

RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo, State of California, that

WHEREAS, Since 2010, 19 new jobs have been created in San Mateo County for every new housing unit that has been built; and

WHEREAS, Supervisors Don Horsley and Warren Slocum convened the Closing the Job/Housing Gap Task Force, which developed an action plan to address this gap and this action plan included developing strategies to increase community participation in housing discussions; and

WHEREAS, the County of San Mateo, on behalf of the Home for All initiative, which is carrying on the work of the Task Force, contracted with a consultant to assess city interest in receiving assistance with fostering community engagement and found that cities in the County are interested in receiving such assistance and that cities also seek to learn what other cities are doing related to housing: and

WHEREAS, Home for All invited cities in the County to apply for a community engagement grant and selected four applicants for such grants, Burlingame, Half Moon

Bay, Portola Valley and Redwood City to receive grants, based on the clarity of the project proposed by the grantees, city commitment to the grant projects, and the learning potential of the projects;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY DETERMINED AND ORDERED that the Board of Supervisors approves grants of Measure K funds to support city participation in the Home for All community engagement pilot project in the following amounts: \$12,500 for Burlingame; \$23,200 for Half Moon Bay; \$23,000 for Portola Valley; and \$20,000 for Redwood City.
