**SUBJECT:** Agreement with 21<sup>ST</sup> Century Environmental Management of California,

LP (PSC)

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

Adopt a Resolution authorizing the:

- A. President of the Board to execute an Agreement with 21<sup>ST</sup> Century Environmental Management of California, LP (PSC), to process hazardous waste from the County's various household hazardous waste facilities for the term July 1, 2012 through June 30, 2015, in the amount of \$1,500,000; and
- B. Chief of the Health System or designee to execute contract amendments which modify the County's maximum fiscal obligation by no more than \$25,000 (in aggregate), and/or modify the contract term and/or services so long as the modified term or services is/are within the current or revised fiscal provisions.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

The current agreement to process and dispose of hazardous waste is with 21<sup>ST</sup> Century Environmental Management of California, LP (PSC). The contract ends on June 30, 2012.

Environmental Health (EH), conducted a Request for Proposals (RFP) to process and dispose of hazardous waste on January 9, 2012. 21<sup>ST</sup> Century Environmental Management of California, LP (PSC) met all the requirements of the RFP process and was chosen based on its ability to provide equipment, supplies, and labor; on its ability to collect, transport and dispose of waste for the Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Program, and on its twenty years experience in the industry.

#### **DISCUSSION:**

EH operates a HHW Program that collects and safely processes HHW from residents. During the past three years, the number of homes served has remained consistent, at an average of 1,644 per month. The annual hazardous waste volume averages 561 tons.

The State Department of Toxic Substance Control continues to add new items that are required to be managed as hazardous waste, thereby increasing staff workload.

Improved program operations include new curbside battery recycling services managed by the garbage haulers, new universal waste Take-It-Back opportunities managed by others, and full in-house staffing within the HHW Program.

County Counsel has reviewed and approved the Agreement and Resolution as to form. Contractor meets insurance certification requirements.

The contractor has assured compliance with the County's Contractor Employee Jury Service Ordinance, as well as all other contract provisions that are required by County ordinance and administrative memoranda, including but not limited to insurance, hold harmless, non-discrimination and equal benefits.

The Agreement with 21<sup>ST</sup> Century Environmental Management of California, LP (PSC) contributes to the Shared Vision 2025 outcome of an Environmentally Conscious Community by ensuring that household hazardous waste does not pose a health and safety danger to residents or cause environmental damage through improper disposal onto lands or waterways. It is anticipated that 100,000 gallons of household hazardous waste will be diverted from landfill disposal.

#### FISCAL IMPACT:

The term of the Agreement with 21<sup>ST</sup> Century Environmental Management of California LP (PSC) is July 1, 2012 to June 30, 2015. The total obligation under this Agreement is \$1,500,000 and is funded through revenue from AB939 fees for HHW Program. The Board adopted a Resolution which established AB939 fees based on waste disposal tonnage. An appropriation of \$500,000 is included in the EH FY 2012-13 Recommended Budget. There is no Net County Cost.
