WHEREAS, In 1972, Committee for Green Foothills inspired an initiative with a charter to acquire lands for protecting open space leading to the creation of the Midpeninsula Regional Open Space District; and

WHEREAS; Committee for Green Foothills remains vigilant and profoundly engaged in curbing urban sprawl and protecting the quality of life in the communities of San Mateo County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors of San Mateo County congratulates the Committee for Green Foothills upon its 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. The Board hereby expresses its gratitude and adds sincere wishes for many more years of success in safeguarding the Peninsula's open space and wilderness.
