Subject: Agreement with PetData, Inc. for Animal Licensing Services

RECOMMENDATION:

Adopt a Resolution authorizing an agreement with PetData, Inc. to provide animal licensing services, for the term of July 1, 2013 through June 30, 2016, in an amount not to exceed \$600,000.

BACKGROUND:

In December 2007 PetData, Inc. was selected to provide animal licensing services for San Mateo County as the result of a Request for Proposals (RFP) process. This selection resulted in an annual savings to the shared cost to the cities and County for the Animal Control Program of approximately \$150,000 per year.

PetData, Inc. a Texas-based company, currently contracts with over 45 cities and counties throughout the country with 16 jurisdictions in California. PetData, Inc. has provided animal licensing services to the County from 2008 through 2012 with no fee increases.

PetData, Inc. continues to offer a fast and efficient licensing turnaround time, utilizing vaccination data to locate previously unlicensed animals, developing methods to increase veterinarian participation, and participating in community outreach and education, all with the goal of increasing animal licensing and rabies vaccination compliance in our county. PetData, Inc. offers a dedicated County customer service hotline for the public and an increasingly popular option to pay for a license online. While under contract with PetData, Inc., there has been an increase in licensing compliance between 2007 and 2012 of approximately 28%.

The Animal Licensing Program is fully funded by revenues collected through animal licensing.

DISCUSSION:

In December 2012 a RFP process was conducted to provide animal licensing services. The review committee selected PetData Inc. to provide the services for the County.

Due to their positive, long-term relationship with the County, PetData, Inc. has elected to absorb the majority of the 30% increase in their postal rate hikes and health care insurance rates and only increase their fees for this contract period by 4%.

Public Health, Policy and Planning requests that your Board authorize the Chief of the Health System or designee to execute contract amendments which modify the County's maximum fiscal obligation by no more than \$25,000 (in aggregate), and/or modify the contract term and/or services so long as the modified term or services is/are within the current or revised fiscal provisions.

The agreement and Resolution have been reviewed and approved by County Counsel as to form. The contractor meets insurance certification requirements.

The Contractor has assured compliance with the County's Contractor Employee Jury Service Ordinance, as well as all other contract provisions that are required by County ordinance and administrative memoranda, including but not limited to insurance, hold harmless, non-discrimination and equal benefits.

This agreement contributes to the Shared Vision 2025 outcome of a Healthy Community by protecting the public through licensing efforts. Proper animal licensing is essential to ensure compliance with rabies vaccinations which reduces the potential of a rabies outbreak. It is anticipated that 39,000 licenses will be issued in FY 2014-14.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The term of the agreement is July 1, 2013 through June 30, 2016, in an amount not to exceed \$600,000, of which \$185,000 will be included in the Public Health FY 2013-14 Recommended Budget, and \$190,000 will be included in the Public Health FY 2014-15 Recommended Budget. Similar arrangements will be made for subsequent years. There is no Net County Cost associated with this agreement. The type of service in this agreement is essentially the same as the past five years with a minimal increase of 4% to the payment provision. The Animal Licensing Program is fully funded by revenues collected through animal licensing and partially offsets the cost of Animal Control. The balance of the cost for Animal Control is borne by the cities and by the County, with the County's FY 2013-14 portion not to exceed 4.06%.
