Subject: Agreement with The Herrick Corporation

RECOMMENDATION:

A) Adopt a Resolution authorizing the Sheriff or his/her designee to:

- 1) Execute a Trade Agreement with The Herrick Corporation to furnish and install structural steel, metal decking and stairs for all buildings for the Maple Street Correctional Center at 1300 Maple Street in Redwood City, for the term of August 6, 2013 through August 5, 2016, in an amount not to exceed \$10,677,900; and
- 2) Execute an Owner Assignment and Novation Agreement, necessary to assign the Trade Contract from the County to the Construction Manager; and
- 3) Execute Change Order with the Construction Manager for work associated with this Trade Contract agreement, up to a maximum amount not to exceed 3% of the original Trade Contract amount or any other applicable limitation imposed by prior Board action or statute; and

B) Authorize an additional \$1,067,790 to be allocated to the Project Allowance

BACKGROUND:

After acquiring the 4.85 acres of land in Redwood City, east of Highway 101, on Maple Street at Blomquist Street in December 2010, and approving the scope and size of the jail project at that site in October 2011, the Board approved contracts for jail design, engineering and construction management services on May 8, 2012. By the end of March 2013, the demolition of existing buildings, as well as site clean-up and remediation, was completed. On April 9, 2013, the Board approved contracts for piles and rough grading. On May 7, 2013, the Board approved contracts for electrical,

mechanical, plumbing, security electronics and detention equipment. On July 23, 2013, the Board approved contracts for fire alarm, fire sprinklers, and testing and inspections.

DISCUSSION:

In March 2013, the Sheriff's Office, using outreach that included local advertising and website posting, issued a Request for Statement of Qualifications (RFSOQ) to prequalify potential bidders as the first step of the County's selection process for firms to provide structural steel, metal decking and stairs for the jail project. Five firms responded to the RFSOQ and, after review of those responses, four firms were selected for prequalification: Gayle Manufacturing Co., Inc., The Herrick Corporation, Schuff Steel Company, SME Steel Contractors, Inc. On June 19, 2013, Requests for Bids were sent to each of the prequalified firms. Three firms returned timely bids. After the bids were reviewed, the County's Selection Committee made the recommendation to award the contract to The Herrick Corporation as the lowest responsible bid received for the work.

The scope of work includes, but is not limited to, furnish and install structural steel, metal decking and stairs for all buildings for the Maple Street Correctional Center.

The contractor has assured compliance with the County's Contractor Employee Jury Service Ordinance, as well as all other contract provisions that are required by County ordinance and administrative memoranda, including but not limited to insurance, hold harmless, non-discrimination and equal benefits. If the Board approves the award to The Herrick Corporation, the County will enter into the Trade Contract with The Herrick Corporation. Upon execution of the Trade Contract, an Owner Assignment and Novation Agreement will be executed and the Trade Contract will be assigned to Sundt/Layton, the Construction Manager. Sundt/Layton will oversee the performance of the Trade Contract and thus shall be responsible for full liability and financial risk under the Construction Manager at Risk delivery method. A form of the assignment agreement was approved by the Board as part of the approval of the Agreement for Construction Management Services with Sundt/Layton. The Project Allowance increases with the addition of each trade contract by an amount equal to 10% of that trade contract amount. The Project Allowance will be available to pay for the costs of change orders due to unforeseen conditions and scope adjustments up to the amount limited and permitted by law and to pay for other related expenses.

County Counsel has reviewed and approved the Resolution and Agreement as to form. Contractor meets insurance certification requirements.

Approval of this Resolution contributes to the Shared Vision 2025 outcome of a Collaborative Community by ensuring a safe and cost effective replacement jail facility.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The amount of the Trade Contract agreement with The Herrick Corporation is \$10,677,900, with an additional authorization for change orders up to \$320,337 (3%). There is also a Project Allowance allocation of \$1,067,790 which may be used to pay for the costs of change orders and for other project related costs. Funds were appropriated in the FY 2013-14 Recommended Budget to cover these costs through December 2013. The County is planning to issue Lease Revenue Bonds this Fall to fund the Maple Street Correctional Center Project.
