RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE SHERIFF OR HIS/HER DESIGNEE TO: 1) EXECUTE A TRADE CONTRACT AGREEMENT WITH URATA & SONS CEMENT, INC. TO PROVIDE CONCRETE FOUNDATIONS FOR THE MAPLE STREET CORRECTIONAL CENTER AT 1300 MAPLE STREET IN REDWOOD CITY, FOR THE TERM OF AUGUST 6, 2013 THROUGH AUGUST 5, 2016 IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$9,195,000; AND 2) EXECUTE AN OWNER ASSIGNMENT AND NOVATION AGREEMENT, NECESSARY TO ASSIGN THE TRADE CONTRACT FROM THE COUNTY TO THE CONSTRUCTION MANAGER; AND 3) EXECUTE CHANGE ORDERS WITH THE CONSTRUCTION MANAGER FOR WORK ASSOCIATED WITH THIS TRADE CONTRACT, UP TO A MAXIMUM AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED 3% OF THE ORIGINAL TRADE CONTRACT AMOUNT OR ANY OTHER APPLICABLE LIMITATION IMPOSED BY PRIOR BOARD ACTION OR STATUTE: AND B) AN ADDITIONAL \$919,500 TO BE ALLOCATED TO THE PROJECT ALLOWANCE

**RESOLVED,** by the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo, State of California, that

**WHEREAS**, in December 2010, the Board of Supervisors acquired 4.85 acres of land in Redwood City east of Highway 101 for the purpose of constructing a replacement jail and the Board approved a mitigated negative declaration for the replacement jail on that site; and

WHEREAS, a Site Management Plan (SMP) and a CEQA Mitigated Negative

Declaration has been approved by the Board of Supervisors for the replacement jail site; and

WHEREAS, the County desires a qualified trade contractor with the requisite experience and technical qualifications necessary to furnish and install concrete foundations associated with the replacement jail site; and

WHEREAS, the Sheriff issued a Request for Statement of Qualifications in March 2013, seeking statements of qualifications from concrete foundation firms to assist with the

construction of the replacement jail; and

WHEREAS, a selection committee comprised of members of the Construction Manager Sundt-Layton and Sheriff's Office Jail Planning Unit, reviewed and carefully evaluated the statements of qualifications submitted in response to the request; and

WHEREAS, the selection committee prequalified seven firms,: Gonsalves & Santucci Inc. (DBA Conco), Joseph J Albansese, inc., JT Wimsatt Contracting Company, Inc., Largo Concrete Inc., Robert A. Bothman Inc., Roebbelen Contracting, Inc., and Urata and Son's Cement Inc.; and

**WHEREAS,** on June 19, 2013, a Request for Bids was issued to these seven firms; and

WHEREAS, said selection committee is recommending the retention of Urata & Sons Cement, Inc. as the lowest responsible bidder to design, furnish and install concrete foundations for the Maple Street Correctional Center for the amount of \$9,195,000 with an additional authorization for Change Orders with the Construction Manager for work associated with this Trade Contract Agreement, up to a maximum amount not to exceed 3% of the original trade contract amount, or any other applicable limitation imposed by prior Board action or statute; and

WHEREAS, it is recommended by the Sheriff that the Board authorize an additional \$919,500 to be allocated to the Project Allowance to be used for unforeseen conditions or scope adjustments; and

WHEREAS, this Board has been presented with an Owner Assignment and Novation

Agreement and has examined and approved the same as to form and content and desires to

enter into the same;

**NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY DETERMINED AND ORDERED** that the Board of Supervisors authorizes and directs:

- The Sheriff or his/her designee to execute a Trade Contract Agreement with Urata & Sons Cement, Inc. to provide concrete foundations for the Maple Street Correctional Center in an amount not to exceed \$9,195,000.
- The Sheriff or his/her designee to execute an Owner Assignment and Novation Agreement, necessary to assign the Trade Contract from the County to the Construction Manager
- 3. The Sheriff or his/her designee to execute Change Orders with the Construction Manager for work associated with this Trade Contract agreement, up to a maximum amount not to exceed 3% of the original trade contract amount, or any other applicable limitation imposed by prior Board action or statute.
- 4. An additional \$919,500 be allocated to Project Allowance to be used to pay for the costs of change orders due to unforeseen conditions and scope adjustments up to the amount limited and permitted by law, and to pay for other project related expenses
