# Claim # Claimant

## **Recommended Board Action and Basis**

M13-040 Ganley, Stephen

No statutory basis for excuse

Claimant was examined and worked up in SMMC Clinic and given anti-viral medication on February 13, 2014 by Jeanette Aviles, M.D. He was told to return for follow up within a month but failed to do so. He eventually returned to the clinic in April 2014, and was evaluated for possible hepatitis (a potential risk of the medication), but likely did not have liver disease.

On October 8, 2014 his lawyer presented a claim falsely alleging he had been improperly prescribed the medication on May 8, 2014 (which would have made the claim timely if that were the date of prescription.) The claim was returned as untimely, as it was presented nearly 8 months after the medication was prescribed and administered, and the attorney was advised he had the right to seek permission to submit a late claim.

The petition to submit a late claim was received by the clerk on November 19, 2014. He is required to show excusable mistake or neglect as a basis for his tardiness. The only fact alleged as to mistake is the repetition of the false statement that he did not become aware of the effects of the medication until May 8. Therefore, it is our recommendation that his application for permission to submit a late claim be denied by the Board.

Careful consideration of these claims contributes to the Shared Vision 2025 outcome of a Collaborative Community by ensuring fair and equitable handling of all claims while conserving financial resources and protecting assets.
