**Subject:** Agreement with the City and County of San Francisco Department of Public

Health to provide HIV Prevention Services.

# **RECOMMENDATION:**

Adopt a resolution authorizing an agreement with the City and County of San Francisco for funding to provide HIV prevention services for the term of January 1, 2015 through December 31, 2015, in an amount not to exceed \$410,906.

### **BACKGROUND:**

The San Mateo County Public Health STD/HIV Program (SMSH) provides HIV education, counseling and testing; linkage to care and treatment; retention and reengagement in care; and partner services and prevention to San Mateo County residents. Funding for these services comes from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and is administered by the Eligible Statistical Area's designated fiscal agent, the City and County of San Francisco (CCSF).

### **DISCUSSION:**

This funding will be used to offset the cost of 2.7 FTE community worker positions, a 0.4 FTE community program specialist and a 0.6 FTE communicable disease investigator, as well as laboratory expenses, mileage and educational supplies.

This contract is delayed because CCSF did not send the agreement to SMHS until mid-April 2015.

The resolution contains the County's standard provisions allowing amendment of the County's fiscal obligations by a maximum of \$25,000 (in aggregate).

The agreement and resolution have been reviewed and approved by County Counsel as to form.

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The agreement contributes to the Shared Vision 2025 outcome of a Healthy Community by providing HIV prevention services to individuals affected by HIV/AIDS. It is anticipated that these services will enable 90% of HIV-positive clients who are linked to primary care services by SMHS to improve their quality of life.

### **FISCAL IMPACT:**

The term of the agreement is January 1, 2015 through December 31, 2015. The amount of the agreement is \$410,906, of which \$205,453 is included in the Public Health, Policy and Planning (PHPP) FY 2014-15 Adopted Budget and \$205,453 will be included in the PHPP FY 2015-16 Recommended Budget. There is no net county cost.
